Activity principles

- **“Working toward reconciliation.”**

Reconciliation between God and mankind, among mankind, and between mankind and creation. Working toward the creation of new relationships based on the gospel.

- Keeping our eyes focused on the Christ of the cross, who is working in the midst of the pain, sadness, and suffering of the stricken areas. Approaching the people in stricken areas with respect, valuing those relationships of mutual learning, sharing the life and hope of the resurrection.



Activity objectives

(A) **Solidarity with churches** in stricken areas

- i Sharing the pain, joy and toil of the churches in stricken areas.
Praying with and supporting one another.
- ii Assisting those churches so that they will be able to work enthusiastically for missions.
- iii Studying together the issues raised by the disasters.


(B) **Supporting communities through the churches** in stricken areas

Supporting the work of reconciliation that those churches are carrying out in their communities (sharing the pain of the disasters, standing close by them and building new relationships).

(C) **Supporting those areas directly**

- i Supporting the Sanriku coastal area, which the JBC has not been able to establish contact with in the past. Paying close attention to building relationships with the residents there and providing the support that we are able to as Christians.
- ii Solidarity with those who are walking with the unseen burdens of the nuclear disaster, with special attention to supporting the lives of children.
- iii Recognizing our prophetic mission to speak up to the government, local authorities and to the world.

They have sent several other relief teams after this first visit.


Baptist Roundtable Summit on the Recovery Efforts
